SEN TALK CIC, a non-profit organisation established in 2016, supports Neurodivergent children, young people, and their families. These activities also focus on improving family well-being and providing caregivers pastoral support, advice, and guidance. Initially based in Wandsworth, Southwest London, the organisation is now transitioning to Hampshire, where its impactful activities and leading organisation will be established. This transition is a significant step in our mission to reach and support more families.

In the UK, Neurodivergent children and young people, particularly those with Autism Spectrum Conditions (ASC) and ADHD, statistically achieve lower educational outcomes compared to their neurotypical peers. They are also at a significantly higher risk of experiencing adverse outcomes later in life, including poorer mental health, exclusion, and social isolation. These factors can profoundly impact their well-being and their families' quality of life.

SEN TALK's Mission is to significantly reduce adverse outcomes and provide unique opportunities for Neurodivergent children and young people to develop skills, enhance well-being, and foster community belonging.

Our AIMS are to:

- Increase parents' capacity to address the knowledge gap for Neurodiversity and empower families to advocate for their child or young person.
- Support children and young people in developing skills that help them overcome learning barriers and improve well-being.
- Build communities that foster a sense of belonging, advocating for young people and parent carer's voices, placing value on lived experience.
- Support young people in preparing for the future and reaching their desired goals in different areas of their lives.
